

## **Annexure F: Flower Valley Conservation Trust Project Implementers**



The data points were then arranged into 54 themes within the context of the open-ended question it was attached to. These data points were arranged into themes and related themes collapsed into one another. Thus, ending with 35 categories that were arranged into the key questions that were required as part of the evaluation. Of the eight key questions, two questions were data deficient






